
W&M

- 1,299 respondents (37% rate of response)
- ~ 850 actual respondents (24%)
- Margin of error: +/- 3%
- Over-represents women

Comparison Group (2011-2014)

- 13,776 respondents
- 52 campuses
 - 24% public
 - 37% Protestant affiliated
 - 21% Catholic affiliated
 - 19% private nonsectarian

W&M Student Worldviews (2014)




Worldview Majority: Protestant, Orthodox, Roman Catholic Christian


Nonreligious: Agnostic, Atheist, Nonreligious, "None," Secular Humanist

Muslim Acceptance on Campus










Informal Engagement with Diverse Peers
