




Affordability:

- 1. Student debt has plateaued in recent years.
 - Both the percentage of bachelor's degree recipients with debt and the amount owed remained relatively stable in the last three years.
- 2. The amount of debt has been stable at the median and 75th percentiles. The 25th percentile saw a modest decline last year.


Average Net Price by Income, Students Receiving Financial Aid




Percent of Graduates with Student Debt






Sources of State Appropriated Funds \$372.55 million





\$370.15 million




Sources of E & G Revenue \$191.9 million




Expenditures by E & G Program
