





#### DO YOU KNOW WHAT EMPLOYERS ARE LOOKING FOR?

#### **Career Management**

- Articulate skills, strengths, knowledge and experiences relevant to the position desired
- · Identify and explore career goals
- Recognize areas necessary for professional growth

#### **Critical Thinking**

- · Exercise sound reasoning to analyze issues
- · Make decisions, and overcome problems
- Obtain, interpret, and use knowledge, facts, and data

#### **Professionalism**

- Demonstrate personal accountability and effective work habits
- Demonstrate integrity and ethical behavior
- Acts responsibly with the interests of the larger community in mind



## 2016 Fall Events by the Numbers

### Diversity Networking Brunch

- 17 Employers in attendance
- 63 Students in attendance
- Students had the opportunity to network with and explore diversity programs at some of the businesses recruiting on campus

### Career & Internship Fair

- 85 Employers in attendance
- 1,020 Students in attendance (New Record 18% increase over 2014 and 2015)
- 842 Undergraduate Students, 174 Graduate Students, 4 Alumni
- Students from 57 different majors represented

## 2016 Fall Events by the Numbers

## Graduate/Professional School Fair

- 101 Unique recruiting programs in attendance
- 178 Students in attendance (A 32% increase over 2015)
- 100 Students attended panels and workshops
- 106 Seniors, 49 Juniors, 14 Sophomores and 9 Freshmen

### Meet the Firms Friday

- 37 Employers in attendance
- 352 Students in attendance
- Highest represented majors: Accounting, Finance, Economics & Government
- Slight increase over 2015 attendance

## 2016 Fall Events by the Numbers

### From DoG St. to Wall

- Over 40 W&M Alumni participated in panels and presentations about finance career options
- Student attendees were given the opportunity to network with professionals from a broad mix of financial firms, and explore a number of career opportunities in the financial services industry

### Wall Street Program

- 16 students participated in the trip to NYC
- Students had the opportunity to visit 12 investment banks over the span of 3 days learning about IPO's, M&A, Private Banking, Investment Banking, etc.

## Fall Recruiting Consortium

- 20 employers participated, hosting interviews across the curriculum
- W&M Students participated in 44 interviews over the course of the day
- 25 Unique Students participated (with at least 1 interview)
