Origins and Nature of Feasibility Study

- June 2015: VA Commission on Military Installations and Defense Activities issues "Growing the Military Mission in the Commonwealth of Virginia"
- Top recommendation is creation of W&M "Whole of Government" Center of Excellence (COE) to help multiple agencies develop understanding of and common approaches to national security issues
- Partnerships with Hampton Roads and other VA military installations
- May 2016: Governor McAuliffe and Secretary Harvey of Veterans and Defense Affairs ask W&M to conduct COE study
- June November 2016: Study conducted in three phases: military, internal, and other federal, state and local stakeholders

External Stakeholder Feedback

- Need to expose future leaders much earlier to the practical realities of interagency collaboration in carrying out particular policy directives
- Desire for new training program for development of leadership and organizational skills that breaks down old disciplinary/professional silos
- Liberal arts education on US history, constitutional law, and the policy process to understand challenges of policy implementation
- Sweet spot is mid-career military and federal officials, as well as other graduate students from NGOs, other nations, and local and state offices
- Table top exercises, details or internships, and substantive real work experience together with first-rate classroom education

W&M: Home for National Security Leaders

- No academic or professional "silos"
- Widely respected for creating leaders and public servants
- Superb research programs on broad national security issues
- Relationships with local, state, national, and international organizations
- Ideal size for incubation of interagency learning with faculty, student, and practitioner collaboration

Next Steps: Stage 1

Fall 2016 – Fall 2017

- Increase enrollment of graduate students from Hampton Roads military bases and other federal/state/local governments in existing MPP program
- Hire new faculty with expertise in international affairs
- Augment ongoing collaborations with partners for national security conferences and workshops, starting Spring 2017
- Request to state for funding

Next Steps: Stage 2

Fall 2017 – Fall 2019

- Further outreach to mid-career professionals
- Forge connections between COE and existing W&M research projects
- Apply for grant funding and tie research to curriculum
- Engage appropriate government agencies and private donors to create dedicated funding streams

Next Steps: Stage 3

Fall 2019 onward

- Hire new faculty for expanded curriculum
- Launch innovative, "hands on" practical training programs
- Additional seed funding for research projects
- Disseminate results of research
