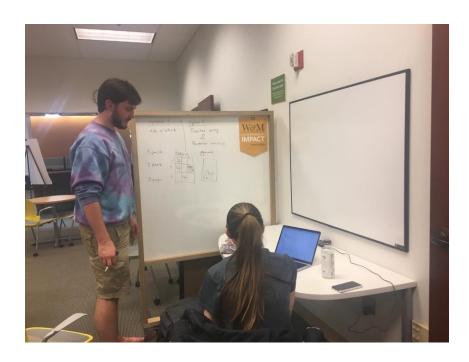

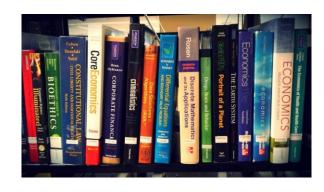

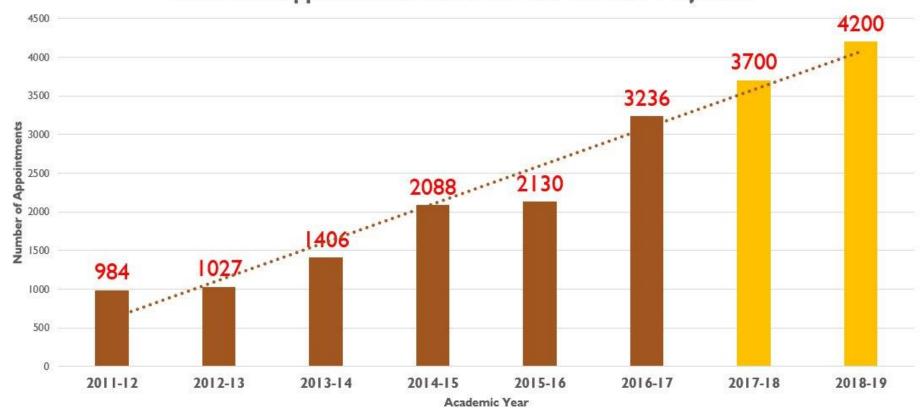
Why Students Seek Tutoring
