A Bill

To subsidize the cost of durable medical equipment

Bridging Resources for Access to Crutches and other Equipment (BRACE) Act

Sponsored by Class President Zoe Wang (26) and Senator Matthew Hwang (25)

Co-Sponsored by Class President Mia Tilman ('24)

Supported by Student Health Center Medical Director and Staff Physician Dr. Dafashy, Student Health Center Lead Administrative Coordinator/Office Manager Cheryl Harris, Student Health Center Pharmacist Maureen Bounds

WHEREAS, student health is an integral aspect of a student's overall wellness at William & Mary;

WHEREAS, the goal of the Student Assembly is to promote public health and wellness in the campus community;

WHEREAS, durable medical equipment provided by the Student Health Center includes orthopedic supplies such as crutches, knee braces, angle braces, and wrist braces;

WHEREAS, without subsidization, students would pay anywhere between \$6.00 and \$46.00 for the cost of orthopedic equipment;

WHEREAS, this bill would support the Student Health Center's goal of being Accessible and Affordable;

WHEREAS, this bill aligns with the Student Activities Fee's purpose to foster well-being in the student experience at William & Mary;

WHEREAS, access to off-campus sources for durable medical equipment is limited;

WHEREAS, this would be test pilot program to investigate if it would be sustainable and beneficial for Student Assembly to fund the subsidization of durable medical equipment every year;

WHEREAS, the genesis for this bill came out of conversations that Class President Mia Tilman, Class President Zoe Wang, and Senator Matthew Hwang with Dr. Dafashy - he recommended durable medical equipment as an item that Student Assembly can subsidize to make a big impact with a relatively low amount of funding;

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Student Assembly of William & Mary:

- 1. Allocates \$1,000 from the Student Assembly reserves to the Student Health Center to subsidize cost of durable medical equipment to make it free for students;
- 2. Charges the sponsors of the bill to coordinate with the appropriate administrators to distribute the funds allocated;
- 3. Stipulates that all unused funds be returned to the Student Assembly Reserves.
